The course also covers the post Contract award phase including all contract management disciplines and claim management issues. The third day workshop is dedicated to case studies and real-life cases.

This practical training course explains and illustrates the use of the FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Construction (the "Construction Contract") and the FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Plant and Design-Build (the "Design-Build Contract").



The training course provides the necessary knowledge for professionals from Private Sector Employers, Consulting Engineers, Contractors, Architects.
