Dear Members,

All <u>national governments</u> have taken emergency measures to address the health crisis caused by the Coronavirus outbreak. They also have made available a range of national business support measures to businesses and employees.

On 26 March, the <u>European **Council**</u> agreed to continue to work along the following five strands:

- limiting the spread of the virus
- providing medical equipment, with a focus on masks and respirators
- promoting research, including research into a vaccine
- tackling socio-economic consequences
- helping citizens stranded in third countries.

On 31 March, the **EFCA** Board of Directors discussed via Microsoft Teams how the federation could assist its members and the European industry.

It was decided to issue a **weekly quick update** on relevant EC actions (and EFCA interventions) and share (national) best practices.

At the same time, **the secretariat is inviting you all** to send - for sharing with your colleagues - guidance and (online) resources that could assist member firms in other countries.



## EC guidance to ensure the free movement movement of critical workers

Practical advice to ensure that mobile workers within the EU, particularly those in critical occupations to fight the coronavirus pandemic, can reach their workplace. The guidelines identify a range of workers (e.g. engineering professionals) that exercise critical occupations, and for which continued free movement in the EU is deemed essential.
